### Complimentary Tickets & Pass Lists

Complimentary admissions can only be provided through a pass list. Each individual on a student-athlete's pass list will need to show identification in order to receive their complimentary admission.

- An institution **MAY NOT** provide a special arrangement to sell a student-athlete ticket(s) to an athletics event. ***Tickets shall be available for purchase by student-athletes according to the same purchasing procedures used for other students.***
- A student-athlete **MAY NOT** purchases tickets for an ***intercollegiate athletics event from the institution and then sell the tickets at a price greater than their face value.***
- An institution or any representative of its athletics interests **MAY NOT** purchase or otherwise obtain tickets to a ***professional sports event and make these tickets available to student-athletes en-rolled in an NCAA member institution.*** Such a gift of tickets would represent an unacceptable extra benefit.
- ***Individuals designated by the student-athlete to receive complimentary admissions are NOT permitted to receive any type of payment for these admissions*** or to exchange or assign them for any item of value. Receipt of payment for complimentary admissions by such designated individuals is prohibited and considered an extra benefit.

## INTERP. CENTRAL:

YOUR ONE STOP SHOP FOR ANSWERS!

**Q:** Can I send a *holiday card* to a recruit?

**A:** Under NCAA Bylaw 13.4.1.1 these cards are **NOT** permissible. However, note cards containing the institution's name and institutional logo or an athletics logo on the outside may be permissible. These cards **MAY NOT** contain any preprinted information (e.g., greetings, words, pictures) on the inside. Traditional holiday cards are not permissible. Thus, *the ONLY permissible cards a coach may send to a prospect are institutional note cards and blank postcards issued by the U.S. Postal Service. Institutional note cards may not exceed 8 1/2 by 11 inches when opened in full.*

**Q:** Is it permissible for a prospective student-athlete to serve as a ball girl or ball boy at a U athletics event?

**A:** *No. It is not permissible for a prospect to serve as a ball girl or ball boy at a U athletics event. Individuals in eighth grade or below may serve as ball girls/boys.*



**Bylaw 16.1 applies to awards received by a student-athlete while enrolled during the academic year**

Athletics awards given to individual student-athletes shall be limited to those approved or administered by the member institution, its conference or an approved agency. These awards **MAY NOT be sold, exchanged, or assigned for another item of value**, even if the student-athlete's name or picture does not appear on the award.

- **Participation Awards** may be presented each year and are limited in value and number as specified in Bylaw 16.
- **Senior Scholar-Athlete Awards** may be provided by the institution to a maximum of two senior scholar-athletes each year to graduating seniors. The award may consist of a tangible item valued at not more than \$175 and a postgraduate scholarship not to exceed \$5,000.
- **Conference and National Championship Awards** may be presented each year, limited in value and number as specified in Bylaw 16. Only student-athletes who were eligible to participate in the event may receive an award.
- **Special Achievement Awards** may be provided each year to individual student-athletes and teams to recognize special achievements, honors and distinctions, limited in value and number as specified in Bylaw 16.
